LOT 118 - Headline: **Colt Model 1862 Pocket Navy Percussion Revolver.**

LOT 206 - ".C. GOVE/DENVER COL" marked lock. Barrel key tenon, rear upper tang screw, and part of the set trigger.

LOT 398 - Gun A caliber: 45.

LOT 516 - Gun E caliber: 8mm.

LOT 636 - Consignor attributes the receiver to Philadelphia Ordnance.

LOT 712 - Headline: **New York Shipped U.S. Colt Model 1911 Semi-Automatic Pistol with Holster.** Shipped on March 18, 1918, to the adjutant general of New York.

LOT 767 - Headline: **Colt Model 1902 Sporting Semi-Automatic Pistol.**

LOT 949 - Barrel is 26 inch round.

LOT 2133 - Gun B headline: **Burnside Third Model Carbine.**

LOT 2169 - Headline: Gun A: **Cooper Firearms Co. Navy Model Revolver with Holster.** Caliber: .36

LOT 2307 - Caliber: .41 Colt

LOT 2471 - Headline: **World War II Japanese Surrender Nagoya Arsenal Type 14 Nambu Semi-Automatic Pistol with Holster and Accessories.** Estimate: 3750 - 5500.

LOT 2532 - Consignor attributes the receiver to Philadelphia Ordnance.
Estimate: 2250 - 3750.

LOT 2533 - Estimate: \$2000 - \$3000.

LOT 2740 - Gun A headline: **Colt Model 1903 Pistol with Rare Backwards Cut Slide Serrations.** This slide serration anomaly is discussed on page 19 of "The Colt Pocket Hammerless Automatic Pistol" by Brunner.

LOT 2541 - Gun B Caliber: 45 ACP.

LOT 2760 - Headline: **Browning Brothers Shipped Three-Digit Serial Number Colt New Service Double Action Revolver in .44-40 W.C.F. with Factory Letter.** The factory letter lists this early New Service revolver in .44 caliber with a 5 1/2 inch barrel (currently 7 1/2 inches).
Estimate: 2250 - 3750.

LOT 2823 - Gun A headline: **Colt First Series Woodsman Match Target Pistol.**

LOT 4240 - Caliber: 44.

LOT 4245 - Consignor indicated this is Woodhead's marking.

LOT 4296 - Small retaining screw absent on rear of trigger housing.

LOT 4559 - Caliber: 38 S&W.

LOT 4608 - Headline: **Colt New Service Double Action Revolver with Factory Letter Owned by U.S. Army Officer Arthur Rutledge Underwood, a West Point Classmate of General George S. Patton** Caliber: 45. The included factory letter confirms the revolver was shipped on September 23, 1909 to Lt. A. R. Underwood. The cylinder has been shaved to accommodate 45 ACP.

LOT 4647 - This pistol is listed on p. 223 of "The Government Models: The Development of the Colt Model 1911" by Goddard as originally shipped 7 February 1908 to Chas. W. Arnold, returned on 2 March 1908, and shipped again to Lee, Glass, Anderson Hardware Co. for Big Horn Sheep Co. on 11 March 1908. This is one of only 440 Colt 1905s cut for.

LOT 4965 - Estimate: 3000 - 5000.

LOT 5131 - Manufactured in 1983.
