LOT 6 - Classified as curio & relic handgun.

LOT 8 - Headline should read: **Colt MK IV Series 70 Government Model Semi-Automatic Pistol.**

LOT 17 - Headline should read: **Custom Strayer-Voigt 1911 Semi-Automatic Pistol with Accessories.** Custom race gun built on a Strayer-Voigt frame. Features a Kart 9mm NM barrel, charging handle, ambidextrous thumb safety, extended slide release, and extended magazine release. With C-More red dot sight, Bianchi International belt with competition holster, four additional magazines (various capacities), three CR Speed magazine pouches, and additional magazine springs with followers.

LOT 68 - Headline should read: **Winchester Custom Shop Model 70 Ultimate Classic Bolt Action Rifle in .338 Winchester Magnum with Box and Factory Letter.** Description should read: The included Winchester Custom Shop letter confirms the serial number, caliber, and major features of this rifle. Features a 26" Krieger chrome-moly match grade tapered round barrel and hand cut checkered fancy American walnut stock with hand rubbed oil finish, 1" black recoil pad, and ebony forend tip/pistol grip cap. The Winchester "horse and rider" logo is encased in circle and gold plated on the floorplate. Right side of the barrel is marked "ULTIMATE CLASSIC" with both the "WP" Winchester proof and "C/CS" Winchester Custom Shop proof atop the breech end of barrel. Includes a Winchester factory box (unnumbered) and lock.  
 Estimate should read: 2000 - 3000.

LOT 139 - Manufactured 1964.

LOT 160 - Estimate should read: 700 - 100.

LOT 161 - Headline should read: **Winchester Model 61 Slide Action Rifle in .22 Winchester Magnum Rimfire.** Estimate should read: 1500 - 2250.

LOT 191 - Headline should read: **London Small Arms MK III Bolt Action Rifle.** Dated "1914". Electricians tape wrapped around the forearm.

LOT 209 - Gun 'A' headline should read: **Enfield No. 2 MK 1 Revolver.** Rating should read: NE WW.

LOT 231 - Consignor indicates the sword was formerly owned by William P. Thacher who enlisted on October 14, 1861 and served with the 46th Ohio Regiment during the Civil War. Thacher was commissioned for meritorious service as a Second Lieutenant while participating in numerous battles including Sherman's March to the Sea campaign. He was honorably discharged on April 29th, 1864.

LOT 237 - Bore is slightly darkening, light to moderate pitting.

LOT 326 - Headline should read: Glock Model 26 Semi-Automatic Pistol with Case .

LOT 409 - Serial number should read: 126650U9 - Curio & relic handgun.

LOT 472 - Consignor indicates the shotgun was engraved by master engraver Ken Hurst who had previously worked for both Colt and Winchester. Rating should read: NE NPRF WW.

LOT 534 - Headline should read: **Springfield Armory Inc. 1911A1 Semi-Automatic Pistol with Box.** Includes a manual.

LOT 555 - Gun 'C' headline should read: **Winchester Model 270 Slide Action Rifle.**

LOT 595 - Headline should read: **Pre-War Smith & Wesson K-22 Masterpiece Double Action Revolver.**

LOT 652 - Headline should read: **Remington Model 770 Bolt Action Rifle with Box and Scope.**

LOT 678 - Gun 'A' serial number should read: 3109713.

LOT 741 - Includes an ill-fitting 22" .22 Short barrel. Long screw to attach stock to the receiver is absent. With factory box and loose parts. Modern long gun.

LOT 786 - Gun 'A' headline should read: **Jukar/Connecticut Valley Arms Kentucky Percussion Rifle.** Does not include extra stock & parts. Gun 'B' item is a kit gun. With importers box, extra 28" 50 percussion barrel numbered 33178, and parts.
