LOT 479 - Included with the lot is a green painted field mount tripod, green painted Shell-Mex & BP Ltd oil can with spigot, a length of steam hose, and a length of non-disintegrating canvas belt.

LOT 3180 - Per Wilkerson and Hoyt's "The Official Record of the Colt Single Action Army Revolver 1873-1895" on page 98, "The first revolvers listed 'soft for engraving' went to Hartley & Graham on April 1 [1881]. The order was for 25 revolvers in .45 caliber and 25 in .44-40. All had 7 1/2 inch barrels." The authors noted that most of these revolvers such as this example were in the 68000 serial number range. This SAA is one of the first shipped in the soft by Colt.

LOT 3254 - This one was manufactured around the 1860s, likely by Henry Deringer.

LOT 3288 - The magazine notes: "July 30th and 31st [1839]. This was for a target excursion and camp duty. Encamped on the heights above the Landing at Cauldwell's, on the Hudson River... There were three prizes, one a splendid rifle presented by Joseph Lewis, Esq., of this city who was the manufacturer of the rifles for the company alluded to above; a man perfectly acquainted with his business, and worthy to be patronized by rifle companies or others; won by Sergeant Watts..." Caldwell is now the Village of Lake George.

William Watts was clearly a sergeant in the Union Riflemen based on the inscriptions and magazine, and Lewis is noted as a gunmaker although he is not listed in "The New York Firearms Trade" unlike several other Lewis gunmakers. He may have been a relative of Nelson Lewis or another of the Lewis gunmakers of New York.
