LOT 1241 – This pistol is pictured and described on p. 416 of "Colt Engraving" by Wilson, where it is noted as having a nickel finish and as showing "no signs of any other finish but nickel." "The Book of Colt Firearms" notes that only 375 of these Vest Pocket pistols were factory engraved, and it is noted that "a few" were fully gold plated, making this a very scarce combination.

CONDITION: Exceptionally fine, retains 98% plus of the professionally applied gold finish with a few scattered patches of very light flaking and spotting.

LOT 1292 - Per information supplied by the consignor, this submachine gun was procured directly from the Police Department of Powell, Wyoming, in 1989, having been told that it was in police inventory for several years, and previously in the inventory of the Sheriff's Department of Big Horn County, Wyoming for an unknown amount of time. The circumstances of the Big Horn Sheriff's Department acquiring the weapon are unknown, though it was likely released as surplus as the U.S. Armed Forces transitioned to the M3A1 "Grease Gun" as the primary military

submachine gun. The consignor has retained the Thompson through the following years, and is believed to be the only private owner of the weapon.
